#### Parish Council Minutes

Abridged minutes from meeting held on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November

**Present:** Councillors B Smyth (Chairman), P Bowyer, M Kasasian, R Oglesby, S Rimmer, W Scott, P Smith, C Wade and the Clerk Roger Coleman. PCSO Maggie Ledbury attended part-time. There were three members of the public present initially.

**Apologies:** Apologies for absence were received from Wiltshire Council Cllr. J Seed.

**Planning:** The Council examined the following planning application and <u>resolved</u> that it is to be passed to the Conservation Officer for comment: 19/10312/LBC, 26 Church Street, replacement of timber framed windows. The Council noted the Village Green (Great Lees Field) Hearing had been held  $22^{nd}$  to  $24^{th}$  October 2019 at Semington Village Hall but that it had been necessary to allocate two further days  $-4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  December - to complete the hearing. Cllr. Scott commented that the initial days had been dedicated to the large number of witnesses giving evidence in support of the application and additional time was required to allow the objectors time to give their evidence. He added that a decision by the Inspector was unlikely before Christmas.

The Chairman stated that no date had yet been allocated for the Planning Appeal in respect of planning application 19/02147/OUT and he observed that any comments in respect of this appeal must be received by the Planning Inspectorate no later than 27th November. Following a short discussion the Parish Council resolved that comments regarding the development be sent to the Planning Inspectorate (full details available in the Parish Council Minutes). In essence Semington Parish Council opposes this development because it seeks to build too many houses in an inappropriate location. Semington Parish Council wishes the Planning Inspectorate to refuse the developer's appeal.

The Council resolved that available parish councillors will attend this Appeal Hearing and that Clir. Scott will take the lead.

Finance: Total balance in hand as at 13th November 2019 £28,002.01

**Highways:** There ensued a lengthy discussion on the subjects of whether or not a Community Speed Watch Scheme or lower speed limits for some roads in Semington should be introduced in Semington. Councillors generally supported the introduction of a 20mph speed limit throughout Semington but considered that a Community Speed Watch scheme was not justified – primarily because of the absence of through traffic and the generally low traffic count in the village. The difficulty of recruiting volunteer members for such a team was also cited as a difficulty. The Chairman asked Cllr. Wade to raise this matter at the next CATG Meeting and to seek guidance on how best to proceed. Meanwhile, the Chairman stated that he would write an appropriate article for the Village Newsletter to seek parishioners' views.

**Environment:** Cllr. Rimmer stated that he had purchased new lights and other related sundries for the Christmas tree and that all that remained was to make the necessary connection to the electricity supply once the tree had been erected. Cllr. Wade confirmed that the tree had been ordered Cllr. Rimmer stated that he had written to Wiltshire Council and had identified two sites that would be suitable for the creation of a 'wildflower meadow' and that Semington Parish Council was interested in participating in the scheme. He added that this correspondence had been acknowledged by Wiltshire Council but no further action had yet been taken. Councillors observed that any discussion on 'village grass cutting' was dependent on further discussions with Wiltshire Council regarding 'wildflower meadows' and the subject was deferred until a subsequent meeting.

**Footpaths:** The Chairman reported that he had now been provided with a spreadsheet by Wiltshire Council on which to record the footpath survey results and to identify where work to clear or restore a public right of way was necessary. He added that he had also been informed of an individual who on a voluntary basis would take the necessary action with Wiltshire Council when 'waymarks/finger posts' required replacing or installing. Cllr. Scott stated that he would send the Chairman a copy of his survey report that identified missing 'waymarks'.

**Semington Village Website:** Cllrs. Rimmer and Kasasian gave a report on a recent meeting with the webmaster and the proposed changes to the website to ensure that it is more relevant and informative for users. They commented that the meeting had been very useful and that the response of the webmaster was very helpful and engaging. An important point was that local organisations should be encouraged to provide content relating to its own organisation and to have the ability to control its inclusion on the website. It was noted that further meetings are planned.

**Tennis Court and Wessex Close Play Areas:** The Council noted the concern expressed by a parishioner during the adjournment regarding the state of the Wessex Close Play Area. The Clerk stated that he had explained the position regarding the maintenance of the Play Area and Play Equipment during the adjournment and the actions he had taken for a repair to be effected to the 'Tornado' equipment — to date without success. Councillors had commented that this Play Area was owned and managed by Wiltshire Council and not the Parish Council and Cllr. Oglesby had added that the cost to the Parish Council of accepting responsibility for the Play Area under the 'Transfer of Assets' scheme was prohibitive.



**20 mph Village Speed Limit** – There has been a suggestion that Semington would benefit from a 20mph speed limit on all roads within the village. #### Thought From The Rectory

"Away in a manger no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head...."

Many of you will have wonderful memories of school and/or church nativities, some very recent and perhaps some from long ago. My favourites include one year when we had three Marys and a different year when the animals at the crib included Scooby Doo. Memories of past nativities and carols can make us smile, but there is a risk that their familiarity can make us forget that the Christmas story includes both difficult events and some difficult people. Some of these circumstances can seem painfully familiar today.

**Mary and Joseph** were forced, by the Roman occupying forces, to travel over 80 miles on difficult tracks and while she was heavily pregnant in order to be counted at a census. Apparently ordinary people were at the mercy of those more powerful.

**The Wise Men** in some ways were not so wise. It was good that they persisted in following the star to find God's promised Messiah/Saviour, but less good that they asked the ruthless King Herod for directions. He was to resort to murder in his unsuccessful attempt to get rid of what he saw as a possible rival.

The Shepherds were outcasts, shunned as unclean by those of higher status. It is no co-incidence that God sent the Angels to the Shepherds to announce that Jesus, his son, had been born. This was a sign – a sign that God loves and cares for everyone, whether rich or poor, powerful or vulnerable. Jesus' birth in a stable was a sign that his power was very different from that of a typical ruler. Jesus came to earth to show us how to love and care for others. Through him we are offered forgiveness by God for our wrongdoing when we say sorry and seek to make a new start. Through him we are offered hope; for we do not have to face life's challenges alone – and we are promised that our souls live on when we die. This is the Good News the world has celebrated at Christmas for over 2000 years. God offers us far more than a time of partying, films and food, enjoyable though they are.
