### This month I am truly humbled

It's taken me some time to be able to share this month's topic with you as the emotion bubbles over each time I revisit the events of October 2018. I know there are always bad news stories in the press about the NHS, but I need and want to share with you what an absolutely blindlingly, amazing thing the NHS is.

Gorgeous George our 2 year old grandson had a persistent wheeze which no amount of anything could shift. A locum doctor insisted something wasn't quite right and sent him to a specialist and in a whirlwind of seven days George ended up being admitted to Alder Hey Children's hospital with a huge aneurysm on the heart which required open heart surgery to fix it.

No one asked for proof of medical insurance, no one asked for a credit card, no one charged his parents accommodation fees as they stayed with him night and day up to and after the operation. No one made the chief anaesthetist cancel their holiday plans — they chose to do it because a little boy needed their expertise, no one had to pay for the 3D model of his tiny heart — they do it as standard because it helps everyone understand the operation that needs to happen.

George's operation lasted six hours and I can honestly say that they were the longest hours of our lives, all of us Aireys. Silence is golden, but when you're waiting for news that all is well, it is also purgatory. As parents and step-parents our jobs are to make sure everything in our family is alright and if it's not then we fix it. I can claim to fix many things, broken zips, holes in jumpers..... but this was so out of my league.

I am truly humbled by the doctors and nurses both in Alder Hey and the whole of the NHS, they fixed George, they made our family alright. There will always be times when the service you get from the NHS isn't quite quick enough and you can't get a doctors appointment. But I ask you to remember that for each time you can't get a doctor's appointment, somewhere, someone's life is being saved by an Air Ambulance response or by a team in an A and E department.

After six hours of open heart surgery, George spent only one night in intensive care and three days later was home – saying thank you does not seem enough..... Alder Hey and the NHS I am truly humbled by you.

### **Parish Council Minutes**

Abridged minutes from meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2019

**Present:** Councillors B Smyth (Chairman), P Bowyer, M Kasasian, R Oglesby, R Robinson, S Rimmer, W Scott and the Clerk, Roger Coleman. There were three members of the public present initially.

**Apologies.** Apologies for non-attendance were received from Parish Councillors P Smith and C Wade and from PCSO Maggie Ledbury.

**Wiltshire Council Report.** In the absence of Cllr. Seed there was no report. Cllr. Oglesby asked the Clerk to request Cllr. Seed to give a report on the proposed Local Government Boundary changes recently promulgated by Wiltshire Council at the next Parish Council meeting.

**Planning:** 29 High Street, Re-reroofing of existing summer house — no objections. There were no planning applications received after 6<sup>th</sup> February 2019. Cllr. Scott reported that in respect of the Village Green application, Wiltshire Council legal officers had informed him that they would be appointing an Inspector to lead the enquiry, although no timescale had been given. He added that all references to the Great Lees Field had been removed from the latest Richborough Development List.

Finance: Total balance in hand at 13th February 2019 £24,121.91

**Highways/Environment.** Cllr. Oglesby commented that it appeared that some work was being undertaken at the Salt Tip related to providing better weather protection for the salt.

Cllr. Rimmer stated that following a request to Wiltshire Council the grit bins in the village had been refilled. The Clerk was asked to include this as a regular item on the agenda for the October Parish Council meetings. Cllrs. Smyth and Robinson stated that they would survey the pathways in the village, following related correspondence from Wiltshire Council, and identify any that required attention that Wiltshire Council had failed to identify. In particular, the pathway from the roundabout to The Knapps was suggested as a possible candidate. Cllrs. Smyth and Scott agreed to survey the village for possible Parish Steward tasks.

The Chairman stated that he had attempted to contact the Operations Manager, Wiltshire Air Ambulance several times, without success in order to discuss the proposal to install an enforcement camera. The Clerk was requested to write to the Operations Manager explaining the intention to install an enforcement camera and to seek a financial contribution from the Air Ambulance. The Chairman stated that the proposal for a Memorial Plaque explaining the Commemorative tree planting had still to be put to the Village Hall Management Committee for approval.

Cllr. Rimmer explained that he had undertaken considerable research on bench seats and that there were various designs that may prove suitable. He added that he had sent these details to all councillors commenting that an oak bench would cost in the order of £350 to £500 plus any delivery charges. There ensured a lengthy discussion on the subject and it was agreed that a small working party comprising Cllrs. Robinson, Scott, Kasasian and Rimmer should examine the various designs and make recommendations regarding the bench at the next Parish Council meeting. Meanwhile, the Council resolved that oak was the preferred material. Cllr. Rimmer confirmed that following discussions with a parishioner, the parishioner had offered to construct the base for the bench seat as a gesture of goodwill. Cllr. Rimmer added that he had written to Wiltshire Council regarding this project to ensure that Wiltshire Council had no objections to the installation of the bench and that he was awaiting a reply.

**Semington Village Website.** Councillors stated that the Parish Council information was up to date on the website but other information was grossly out of date and often irrelevant. Cllr. Scott observed that the only photo on the website showed historical fly-tipping and the photo and the associated commentary gave a very distorted view of the village.

There were many positive messages regarding the village that could, and should, be posted on the website. The general view expressed by councillors was that as it was a village website – not a Parish Council one – village organisations should be encouraged to send copy to the webmaster on a regular basis .....something that was not done at present. It was agreed that a website working party be formed – comprising the same members as for the bench working party with a view to identifying the possible content of the village website and the means of encouraging local organisations to participate. It was agreed that their findings would be presented at the next Parish Council meeting.

Melksham Community Area Board/Community Area Transport Group Meetings. Cllr. Robinson confirmed that he had raised the subject of the Bus Gate Enforcement Camera at the CATG meeting and although the CATG confirmed support for the project it stated that it would not be able to make a financial contribution. He added that Cllr. Seed had indicated that there may be alternative sources of financial support. Councillors commented that at previous Parish Council meetings Cllr. Seed had indicated that Wiltshire Council would have ownership of this project and not the Parish Council as it now appeared that the Parish Council had sole responsibility. Cllr. Robinson agreed to discuss this matter with Cllr. Seed.

#### Your Wiltshire Councillor News

March heralds spring and looking forward to Easter and by now the daffodils will have emerged and be in full bloom. However, there is also some emerging progress in the local and hopefully national political scene. Budget and Brexit have been looming large on our political horizon and by now both ought to have been put to bed. The Wiltshire Council budget has emerged as a balanced budget with virtually no opposition after several months of hard work by Councillors and their officer teams. The almost total cross party support for this process means that Wiltshire Council has managed to make progress on its delivery of front line services at a time when other Councils are having very serious difficulty. This is largely because of the care with which finance has been managed by the Council over many years. So successful have the Council been in managing these finances that in the forthcoming financial year significant extra funding has been made available for road highways maintenance.

We have also had the first decisions from the Local Government Boundary Commission for England on their electoral review of the Wiltshire Council area. The good news is that they have accepted the all-party recommendation of Wiltshire Council to keep the number of Council seats the same at 98, albeit with more electors, and to keep most of the Area Board boundaries intact. The bad news is that there are some areas that the Commission have come up with ideas for change that are not entirely logical. So it is worthwhile having a look at these plans and seeing whether they affect you and if so make a comment on the consultation to committee@wiltshire.gov.uk by 19<sup>th</sup> April when the consultation closes. Unconnected to this is the opening of a review of polling stations and polling districts. This review may well affect where you vote and whether your town or village retains its current polling station(s) so it is important to look at this and register your views in the consultation which closes on 25<sup>th</sup> May. All the detail on this electoral stuff and how to comment in the consultations is easily accessed through the Wiltshire Council Website.

The Police and Crime Panel for Swindon and Wiltshire is there to hold the Police and Crime Commissioner to account but in particular to approve (or decline to approve) any proposed police precept increase. Recently the panel was able to effect a change on the use of the proposed increase in precept. The panel agreed that there were valid reasons for the increase, including an extra £2.25 million being passed on by central government for our local police area to pay in local police pensions. However as a member of the panel I urged the Commissioner to provide more local police officers and the Commissioner agreed to the lobbying and is to provide 26 additional community police officers. This is local democracy at work and was achieved with strong representation by your Wiltshire Councillor and cross Party support.

With all this cross party cooperation in Wiltshire perhaps Parliament could learn a thing or two from the way our councillors work together to deliver solutions for the community we represent!

### **Lasting Power of Attorney**

Many of us know that it is important to write a will, but fewer of us have considered making a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA). It is estimated by the Alzheimer's Society, that by 2025 more than 1 million people in the UK will have dementia, and currently 1 in 5 people over the age of 85 already suffer from it. For those people who do not have an LPA, handling their financial affairs and making medical or care decisions on their behalf can become virtually impossible. An LPA is a legal document in which you can appoint trusted individuals to make decisions on your behalf, known as your 'Attorneys'. There are two different types of LPA:

**Property and Affairs** - This LPA will allow your Attorneys to help you manage your money, property and finances, for example. They can pay your bills, and transfer or invest your money for you. You can tailor the LPA to give as much, or as little, power as you would like to.

Health and Welfare - This LPA will allow your Attorneys to make decisions about your health and care; which may include what medical treatment you receive and where you live. If you are capable of making those decisions yourself then your wishes will be paramount, and your Attorneys will be permitted to liaise with medical professionals etc. in relation to your needs. Nowadays, care homes and medical professionals are asking whether residents and patients have these types of LPAs in place, as many now believe that Health and Welfare LPAs are equally as important as the Property and Affairs LPAs.

If you do not have an LPA in place, and later become mentally incapable, your relatives must apply to the Court of Protection to obtain a Deputyship Order. This would allow them to take control of your assets and finances. However, the application for Deputyship is a very lengthy and stressful process and involves obtaining a medical report confirming loss of mental capacity, and few medical professionals nowadays are prepared to produce such reports.

Do not leave it until it is too late. As with writing a will, you need to have sufficient mental capacity to make an LPA. Writing a LPA does not mean you give up all of your rights. Your Attorneys must allow you to make your own decisions for as long as you are able to do so, and whenever they make a decision for you, it must always be in your best interests. There are strict rules to prevent Attorneys mishandling your money, or making gifts to themselves and others. Careful consideration must be paid to whoever you appoint as your Attorneys and whether they are actually capable of assisting you.

### Thought From The Rectory

In March there are a lot of Christian Festivals – most of which are celebrated widely by those of faith or not. There are two national Saints Days – the Welsh celebrate St David's Day on 1<sup>st</sup> March and the Irish mark the feast day of their patron Saint, Patrick on 17<sup>th</sup>. These men played important roles in spreading Christianity in the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> centuries.



For Christians, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on 6<sup>th</sup> March, but preceding this is Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Day on the 5<sup>th</sup>. The name Shrove comes from the old middle English word 'Shriven' meaning to say sorry for the wrong things you've done. Pancake Day comes from the old English custom of using up all the fattening ingredients in the house before Lent, so that people were ready to fast during Lent. Milk and eggs were mixed with flour to make pancakes.

The name Ash Wednesday comes from the tradition of putting a small cross of ash on people's forehead at Ash Wednesday church services. This is a sign of confession and helps people to remember that they rely on God for forgiveness from their sins. Lent is the period of 40 days before Easter. For Christians, Lent is a time to prepare for Easter and to think about their relationship with God. Some people give up things for Lent as a mark of self-discipline. Others take up something positive for Lent – in our churches we are collecting food for the Foodbank this year.

March 31<sup>st</sup> is Mothering Sunday - a day when we remember our mothers and those who care or who have cared for us. So there are a lot of festivals and events in March, on days that are significant in different ways. Whether you are a proud Welsh or Irish person celebrating your nation, a Christian beginning the journey towards Easter (after a feast of pancakes) or a son or daughter remembering a special figure in your life or a Mum enjoying breakfast in bed, make the most of March.

God wants to bless us with good things, but it also important to sometimes stop and reflect on those good things and be thankful.
