

#### Parish Council Matters

Peter Smith, Chair of the Parish Council

**Berks and Wilts Canal** – there was a presentation to the Parish Council on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> October by representatives of the Canal Trust. They talked about their revised masterplan for the development of a stretch of canal from Semington (just west of the the road bridge) to the River Avon (just west of Melksham). This is known as the Melksham Link.

At present, the plan envisages that the canal will be funded through the building of some 800 houses in and around Berryfield. It does not envisage any building south of the old railway line or west of the new canal itself. As such, a green buffer will be maintained north of the Kennet and Avon canal up to the old railway embankment. There will be an open day run by the Canal Trust on **18<sup>th</sup> November** (10.00am to 9.00pm) in **Berryfield Village Hall** where proposals will be displayed. All are welcome.

**Neighbourhood Planning** – has begun. It is likely that there will be village wide consultation events in the early part of the new year. The aim of these will be to gather in views from all parts of the village and from all age groups on anything and everything that matters to you about Semington; what we want to preserve and improve, what we want to see changed, what we want to add, and what we're prepared to do as a community to realise such ambitions. This consultation will shape the content of our neighbourhood plan and the priorities within in it.

I really hope that, when we are all restored after our first (hopefully!) proper Christmas and New Year since 2019, we can collectively strengthen our village by planning to meet the challenges ahead.

#### **Nature Notes**

**Thomas Hood** was an early 19<sup>th</sup> century poet and writer, best known during his lifetime for *The Song of the Shirt*, which described the harsh conditions faced by the working poor – in this case a seamstress. These are the first few verses from his poem *Autumn*. It takes a gloomy view of the season seeing it caught between the coming harshness of winter and the lost pleasures of the summer months. There is no sense of Keat's "mellow fruitfulness" here, though there is plenty of mist.

I SAW old Autumn in the misty morn Stand shadowless like Silence, listening To silence, for no lonely bird would sing Into his hollow ear from woods forlorn, Nor lowly hedge nor solitary thorn;— Shaking his languid locks all dewy bright With tangled gossamer that fell by night, Pearling his coronet of golden corn.

Where are the songs of Summer?—With the sun, Oping the dusky eyelids of the south,
Till shade and silence waken up as one,
And Morning sings with a warm odorous mouth.
Where are the merry birds?—Away, away,
On panting wings through the inclement skies,
Lest owls should prey
Undazzled at noonday,
And tear with horny beak their lustrous eyes.

Where are the blooms of Summer?—In the west, Blushing their last to the last sunny hours, When the mild Eve by sudden Night is prest Like tearful Proserpine, snatch'd from her flow'rs To a most gloomy breast.

Where is the pride of Summer,—the green prime,—
The many, many leaves all twinkling?—Three
On the moss'd elm; three on the naked lime
Trembling,—and one upon the old oak-tree!
Where is the Dryad's immortality?—
Gone into mournful cypress and dark yew,
Or wearing the long gloomy Winter through
In the smooth holly's green eternity.

#### Parish Council Meeting

#### Abridged Draft Minutes From Meeting Held Wednesday 13th October 2021

**Present:** Councillors P Smith (Chairman), V Bodman, R Bruges, S Chown, J Hailey, M Kasasian, S Rimmer, W Scott, C Wade and the Clerk Roger Coleman. There were two members of the public present initially.

**Wiltshire Council Report:** In the absence of Cllr. Seed, no report was given. Councillors commented that when absent at a meeting he might wish to provide a brief written report. A similar comment was made in relation to the Neighbourhood Policing Team. The Chairman added that he will write to PCSO Gould to check why reports are no longer provided regarding current anti-social or criminal activities in Semington – as had been the practice up until recently.

#### Planning and Development: New applications submitted:

PL/2021/09152 Church Farm, Church Street – repair and refurbish barn to form two garages within it. The Council has no comment.

PL/2021/09400 4 Manor Close – proposed extension to enlarge existing kitchen and provide addition bedroom at first floor level. The Council has no comment.

The Chairman stated that he had attended a Wiltshire Local Plan meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> October at Trowbridge and was advised of a new possible development of land to the east of Trowbridge by Lightwood Strategic in association with the existing landowner. He stated that it was important for Semington Parish Council to continue to be represented at these meetings because the effect of such a large development – some 2000+ houses – would have a profound effect on Semington and he added that together with existing proposals contained in the emerging Wiltshire Local Plan there are now two possible developments being considered for that area.

In respect of the Housing Market Area (HMA) the Chairman stated that Great Hinton Parish Council had written to him supporting the campaign to move Semington and other local villages, including Great Hinton, back into the Chippenham HMA. He added that he had responded to the latest letter from Wiltshire Council (Cllr. Botterill) but it was obvious that Wiltshire Council did not wish to be drawn further into the argument, instead relying on the comments received during the forthcoming Wiltshire Local Plan consultation period before commenting further.

The Council noted that the proposed names to be considered by Wiltshire Council/Newland Homes for the development at St Georges Road were Union Lane, Dragon Lane, Ragged Smock Lane and Kendall Lane. The Council <u>resolved</u> to approve this choice and asked the Clerk to advise Wiltshire Council accordingly.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan:**

The Chairman stated that the first meeting of the Steering Group (SG) was held on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2021 at which a number of agreements were reached, such as Terms of Reference and some roles for members of the SG and some key decisions were taken e.g. to appoint a consultant to assist in the drafting of the plan, to apply for grant aid and to establish a Semington Village Consultation Working Group.

The minutes of this meeting can be viewed on Semington.org.uk The next SG Meeting is to be held on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2021 and a report on that meeting will be given at the next Parish Council meeting to be held on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2021. Finance. Final balance as at 13th October 2021 £44,335.14

#### **Environment and Streetscene:**

Rights of Way: Cllr. Bruges stated that he understood that Wiltshire Council was undertaking two surveys for the cycleway between Semington and Hilperton – one along the A361 road, the other along the HILP22/10 Byway and he questioned the necessity for both surveys to be undertaken when he understood that one of the routes was the favoured one. Cllr. Scott stated that he would make enquiries of Wiltshire Council. The Council <u>resolved</u> that Cllr. Chown is to purchase two 'Villagers at Work' safety signs at a cost of £38 each to protect councillors and parishioners when undertaking community work where traffic may be a hazard.

The Chairman reported that a parishioner has offered a batch of crocus bulbs to the Parish Council for planting out in the village. The Council <u>resolved</u> to accept this offer, to arrange a 'planting party' and to consider a contribution to the charity supplying the bulbs.

#### **Transport and Traffic:**

There was a lengthy discussion on the reported abuses of the 'No Entry' Bus Gate at the northern end of the village on the (old) A350 road and possible means of countering it, although it was thought that the present abuses had been exacerbated by the roadworks on the Semington Bypass road and that following the conclusion of these works the situation might ameliorate. Notwithstanding this, the Parish Council decided to investigate reintroducing the 'Gate Watch' scheme that had proved effective previously and to observe firsthand the current abuses. The Parish Council **resolved** to request that an article be placed on the Facebook website and in the Village Newsletter explaining the background to the restrictions on the bus gate, noting that it is a criminal offence for a motorist to ignore this sign and if a motorist does ignore it a substantial fine and possible points on his/her driving licence could be the result.

#### Recreation and Wellbeing:

Cllr.Wade reported that he is currently working through the list of contacts who have expressed an interest previously in acquiring an allotment plot. He added that he would confirm that the developers are to provide water to the allotment site. Cllr. Scott enquired whether there had been any progress in improving the Wessex Close Play Area. The Chairman reported that some very useful maintenance and improvement work had been undertaken, though there was still work to be done including groundworks in the goal area and new basketball kit. Cllr. Chown reported that a planned meeting to discuss the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme with a person interested in becoming the Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator had been postponed.

#### Community and Communication.


Cllr. Bruges stated that St Georges Church is undertaking a major project in that the Nave is to be restyled to permit, and to encourage, greater use of the church as a community facility and to be better integrated with the village. The Parish Council <u>resolved</u> to fully support the aims of this project.



Whilst my legs regretted completing this walk within just 3 days with no training it was an absolute pleasure to enjoy the wonderful waterways we have in our constituency and I encourage as many people as possible to get out and take full advantage of our canals.

I would like to take this opportunity to encourage as many Semington residents as possible who are eligible to get the flu vaccination this winter. The Government is rolling out the biggest flu programme in history with 35 million people now eligible for a free seasonal flu vaccine. The flu vaccine is given free of charge on the NHS to specific groups of children and adults, your eligibility can be checked online at NHS.uk or with your doctor. You can get the flu vaccine at your local GP service or at a pharmacy offering the service. The NHS have developed a handy tool on their website where you can find pharmacies offering the service.

Following the tragic murder of Sarah Everard, I am pleased that Wiltshire Police will now be proactively offering to carry out a verification check to anyone they engage with. Wiltshire Police will be putting their personal issued radio on loudspeaker and asking a member of control room to confirm who they say that they are on duty. I am pleased that Wiltshire Police are taking important initial steps in order to create greater confidence in the safety of women and girls.

In November, I will be hosting my third over 60s Information and Advice Fair at Springfield Community Campus in Corsham. I have previously hosted this event in Chippenham and Melksham, and I am delighted to be bringing together the local community and raising awareness of the fantastic work local and national organisations do to combat loneliness. I have spoken to many organisations about the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, some have bounced back, others have struggled with membership and attendance, so I hope this event will be positive for them. I also want to assist with those who might have experienced loneliness during the lockdowns and give people the confidence to return to social functions and get involved. Organisations attending this event include: Age UK, Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, Corsham Walking Festival and many more including local groups, societies and charities. This also includes taster performances from the Golden-Oldies!

You may also link into the Men's Shed for £3.50 per session in groups of four (plus a small charge for materials) to get expert help to build a project from wood, renovate your bike, learn how to tile, wire a plug etc.

The Women's Shed is open to any women, any faith or none. We are also taking referrals from Organisations, Health Visitors and Community Workers. May your good memories bring you joy and may God comfort you in those memories that are painful.


