



Parish Council Matters

Speeding - has been a concern raised by parishioners in recent weeks. The main problems reported seem to relate to drivers exiting the Turnpike roundabout and heading north on High Street, where they pick up speed going down the hill between the St. George's Road and Somerset Way junctions. Where buses have been spotted seemingly moving too fast, parishioners have reported the time and location to the bus company (Faresaver), and the company has responded positively. Anecdotally, there were also reports of private cars and unmarked vans speeding.

The Parish Council is to ask Wiltshire Council to set up a speed check on that stretch of road, so that we can get some sort of measure as to the scale of the problem. Once known, Wiltshire Council will be able to advise on what should happen next.

Housing on land south of St. George's Road – Newland Homes is now busy building the 24 homes (and eventually allotments) on the land between The Knapps and St. George's Court. This will fill about half of the land in that field. There is no additional planning permission for any further build in the remaining half of the field.

However, Newland Homes has asked if it may share initial thoughts on that undeveloped half, and will be attending the **January 19th Parish Council meeting** to do that. If you want to hear what is said and ask questions, please make a note now in your diary. The meeting will start at **7:00pm** in the **Village Hall**, all welcome subject to any coronavirus restrictions extant at that time.

Christmas waste collections – will be running on our usual collection dates, whether or not these fall on a bank holiday. The only exception is that whilst there is the normal garden waste service up to and including 16th December 2021, there won't be a garden waste collection on 30th December, but it will resume again on 13th January.

Neighbourhood Watch – a new scheme is to be launched in the new year. Watch out for details of how to get involved in the months ahead.

Finally - season's greetings and best wishes to everyone. Let's hope it's as "normal" as possible.

Michelle Donelan – MP for the Chippenham Ward

It was an honour to attend several Remembrance services across the constituency on Remembrance Sunday and to see the continued and marked respect constituents have for those that bravely gave their lives for this country. We will never forget their sacrifice nor the freedoms for which they fought.

Recently, I have been meeting with care providers and working to convene a round table meeting with the Minister for Care and Mental Health, The Independent Living Centre and Carer Support Wiltshire. I have spoken out numerous times on how we have to improve and reform the social care sector and this year has been so important in finally setting out just how we will prevent spiralling costs, integrate the health and care sectors and invest in the workforce. We also need to make sure Government is aware of issues being faced on the ground and I hope this roundtable with local Semington care charities will make sure these concerns are heard at the heart of Westminster.

Finally, with the Chancellor's Autumn Budget coming through to deliver on our priorities, I wanted to update residents that support is being strengthened for our local pubs such as the Somerset Arms. We have permanently cut the cost of a pint, ended the duty premium on sparkling wine and cancelled the planned increase in duty on spirits, marking a complete overhaul of duty on alcoholic drinks to encourage drinking in pubs rather than in the home. This draught relief is targeted support for community pubs who do 75% of their trade on draught and will be supported by the one-year business rates relief of 50% for all hospitality, retail and leisure businesses. After the year they have had I believe it is absolutely crucial we back our local and support the pub trade.

Parish Council Meeting

Abridged from DRAFT Minutes From Meeting Held Wednesday 23rd November 2021

Present. Councillors P Smith (Chairman), R Bruges, S Chown, J Hailey, M Kasasian, S Rimmer, W Scott, C Wade and the Clerk Roger Coleman. Wiltshire Council Cllr. J Seed attended (Part-time). There was one member of the public present initially.

Apologies. Apologies for non-attendance were received and accepted from Cllr. V Bodman.

Declaration of Interests. There were no interests declared.

Minutes of the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting held on 13th October 2021. The Council resolved that the minutes were a true and accurate record. The Chairman signed the minutes.

Wiltshire Council Report. Cllr. Seed gave the following brief report: Housing Market Area (HMA). He stated that he had received a poor response from the Wiltshire Council Cabinet member responsible for this matter to his request that the move of Semington to the Trowbridge HMA should be reconsidered and for the evidence that supported that original decision by Wiltshire Council should be re-examined. The view of the Cabinet member was that these comments and any others would be taken into consideration during the forthcoming Wiltshire Local Plan consultation period. Semington – Hilperton Cycleway: Cllr. Seed acknowledged the concerns of the Parish Council regarding the possible upgrading of the existing bridleway and the addition of lighting to comprise a 'new' cycleway between the villages. He commented that following discussions with the officer concerned it was now clear that there was not to be a major resurfacing of that bridleway or lighting to be installed thereby allaying the fears of the Parish Council that the rural nature of that path would be destroyed.

Planning and Development. New application PL/2021/10192 22, St Georges Court, Replacement Front Door. The PC has no comments and requests the application is sent to the Conservation Officer for comment. The Council reviewed the correspondence that had been exchanged with Wiltshire Council in relation to the Housing Market Area (HMA) and the Chairman tabled the recent correspondence from Cllr. Scott – full details available on PC website Semington.org.uk The Council noted the proposed presentation by Mike Kurton (Newland Homes Ltd) at the January 2022 Parish Council meeting and the Council decided that the presentation plus a Question and Answer session should take place between 7.00pm and 8.00pm on the **19**th **January 2022** – finishing promptly at 8pm to allow the Parish Council meeting to proceed at that time. The Chairman stated that he would contact Newland Homes.

Neighbourhood Plan. The Chairman reported that at the last Steering Group meeting, consultants had been appointed – Place Studios – and that grant aid is now being sought to help finance this project and a Consultation Working Group had been established to identify the nature and scope of subsequent consultation exercises. He added that it was intended to hold a village-wide event on **12th February 2022** to advise parishioners of progress and to present a draft vision and objectives for Semington over the next 15 years. The Chairman commented that the Wiltshire Council 'link' for the Neighbourhood Plan – David Way – had advised the Steering Group that a Neighbourhood Plan is essentially 'a land use plan' although other issues can be addressed.

Finance. Final balance as at 23rd November 2021 £43,659.13. The Council discussed possible expenditure for FY2022/23 in relation to the 'Theme Groups' and Neighbourhood Planning the following was identified:

Neighbourhood Planning - £1000 Environment/Streetscene – Trees/Bulbs £500, Kissing Gates £1600. Transport & Traffic – SLOW Marking £250. Recreation & Wellbeing – Wessex Close Play Area £5500, NH Watch £450, Allotments £5000. Community & Communication – Noticeboards £1600.

The Chairman stated that the Budget and Precept will be agreed at the December Parish Council meeting. The Clerk commented that following a query from a councillor he had examined the level of uncommitted reserves held by the Council and it was higher than official guidance would suggest. The Clerk added that this needs to be considered at the Budget meeting and identified and agreed projects for FY2022/23 should be earmarked and reserves committed to them.

Environment and Streetscene. The Parish Council resolved to make a donation of £100 to the charity 'End Polio Now' following the gift to the Parish Council of 2500 crocus bulbs from Trowbridge Rotary Club. The Parish Council resolved to purchase and to present a Memorial Wreath each year for Remembrance Day, commencing in November 2022. The Chairman proposed a Village Litter Pick to take place on **18th December 2021.**

Transport and Traffic. The following matters were reported: Speeding Traffic, please see chairman's report page 9. Cllr. Scott advised councillors of the recent email stating that many of the local train services are to be cut – especially those involving Westbury, Salisbury and Waterloo. He invited councillors to make their views known to Network Rail via the online petition. Following a resolution by the Council, the Chairman stated that he would respond on behalf of the Parish Council.

Recreation and Wellbeing. Cllr. Wade reported that he is continuing to progress the acquisition of allotment plots and continues to liaise with the developers – Newland Homes - to obtain further details. The Chairman, on behalf of the Parish Council, thanked Cllr. Chown for organising the recent, very successful, Christmas Fair in the Village Hall. Cllr. Chown reported that she had a meeting to discuss the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme with a person interested in becoming the Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator and Chris Holden had agreed to take the lead. Cllr. Chown added that she is proposing that the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme for Semington is a village-wide scheme and that the whole community will become engaged in the scheme. She anticipated holding regular public meetings for parishioners to gain advice and alerts and to contribute to the work of the Neighbourhood Watch team. The Parish Council resolved to endorse a village-wide scheme. She stated that some new Neighbourhood Watch signs will be required and she agreed to investigate this further.

Community and Communication. The Council resolved to investigate the purchase of two new Noticeboards for the Village Hall and Cllr. Chown agreed to investigate possible designs and costs.

Wiltshire Councillor News

Many of you will be aware that the last six months have been personally fraught for me and the next six months are likely to be little better. However life goes on and regardless of where my current personal journey ends (and I am confident that it will end positively) I want to assure every resident in the new Division of Melksham Without West and Rural that I will represent you to the very best of my ability until the end of my term of office as a Councillor. I attend all seven Parish Councils whenever I can and I am always happy to conduct personal meetings or surgeries with residents at any convenient time. My contact details are below so please get in touch if I can help. Residents of my Council Division may like to be aware that as well as attending the seven Parish Councils in the Division I am also a member of my own village Parish Council in Bromham. After the tragic fire destroyed our village social centre and hall in June I was asked to Chair the Rebuild Committee (which included the sourcing and provision of a temporary village hall) so I am keeping pretty busy with local government matters!

There are several important Wiltshire Council issues that are topical at the moment. The A350 Bypass is nearing a feasibility decision stage and the route is pretty much nearing determination. The possible canal link from Semington to Melksham is also approaching a decision stage. Many residents have expressed concern at the canal route as well as the number of houses needed to fund the project and I suspect that the latter will influence any final decision on the project. Other important issues include a proposed new cycleway linking Melksham to Trowbridge which is causing concern to local horse riders as well as worries about additional lighting. Long term issues include allegations of unauthorised development on traveller sites as well as large scale expansion of a local pub. These together with perennial local planning issues and concerns at poor road surfaces give me plenty of community work to do.

This is the last community message from me before Christmas so I would like to take this opportunity of wishing all the residents of the Parish a Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year!

Please try and leave your items in the Church porch not long before then, if possible, as cardboard items can get a tad soggy if left a long time in the damp air. Remember too that your donations can be left in designated trollies in the big supermarkets in Melksham, plus in some doctors' surgeries. Should you see anyone around the village who may be in need, please encourage them to come to the Foodbank on Mondays and Thursdays from 10.00am – 12.00pm, at Melksham Baptist Church on Old Broughton Road or ask the Vicar, their doctor or social worker for a referral.

Finally, as we approach the end of the year, I would like to thank and pay tribute to every person who has donated food or money to the Melksham Foodbank this year. Whether you have done it once or 52 times, every single thing is appreciated by the volunteers and the clients who receive help. You have been beyond amazing, so give yourselves a pat on the back!

HELP WILTSHIRE AIR AMBULANCE AND DOUBLE YOUR DONATION

Wiltshire Air Ambulance are launching a "double your donation" Big Give campaign to raise funds for new night vision goggles.

The charity operates its lifesaving service up to 19 hours a day and during the winter months more than half a shift can be spent in night vision goggles. Existing sets used by the charity are old and will soon become obsolete, so it needs to raise $\pm 40,000$ to purchase four newer generation night vision goggles.

The Big Give campaign runs from **midday on 30**th **November until midday on 7**th **December**, at which point all donations received will be doubled. Therefore, Wiltshire Air Ambulance needs to generate £20,000 in donations in the week of the Big Give campaign to have the funds doubled by a host of pledgers to £40,000 – enough to purchase the night vision goggles required.

Chief pilot Matt Wilcock said: "With the winter nights upon us, we can operate using Night Vision Goggles for around 10 and a half hours of a 19-hour shift. If we don't have reliable or serviceable night vision goggles we could be prevented from responding in the aircraft when it is dark, which would have a significant impact on our ability to help patients. The four sets of goggles would be used by the three operational crew on shift, with one spare unit to cover when a set goes away for servicing."

Critical care paramedic Sophie Holt said: "The new goggles would include image intensification, ensuring they work better on those nights when there is no moonlight or if cloud cover prevents starlight. It is hugely important that we are able to respond to emergencies for up to 19 hours a day. Thank you in advance to everyone who donates to the Big Give campaign."


