We traipsed through the surrounding roads with no one more official than a ten year Paul Hambleton dressed as a policeman leading the way and shock horror Hi Viz vests had yet to be invented – 200 under 11s living hard and fast the Silver Jubilee way..... And then there was the school jubilee song lyrics written to the tune of Morning Has Broken, 45 years later and much to Gorgeous Hubby's dismay I still remember the opening lines; We're celebrating, this jubilee, With flags and bunting everywhere. I'm pretty sure you will have all had a go at singing that and yep you really do have to make' jubilee' and 'everywhere' stretch to fit. Apologies for the earworm but if you'd like to join me in a rendition I'll see you on the high street on Sunday!


Suzie (Suzanne to you and me) lives in Semington and is mum to Harribo the black working cocker for all you dog walkers out there, here's Suzanne's story:

On Scratchbury Camp - Siegfried Sassoon

Scratchbury Camp is an Iron Age hill fort on Scratchbury Hill, overlooking the Wylye valley east of Warminster. It's a favourite haunt of a number of ramblers in the village because of its views, birds, butterflies, flowers and history.

Although Sassoon is perhaps best known as a first world war poet, he drafted this poem on June 2nd 1942. He would have known this land well as he lived in nearby Heytesbury. In this poem, he captures something of the timelessness of our county.

Along the grave green downs, this idle afternoon, Shadows of loitering silver clouds, becalmed in blue, Bring, like unfoldment of a flower, the best of June.

Shadows outspread in spacious movement, always you
Have dappled the downs and valleys at this time of year,
While larks, ascending shrill, praised freedom as they flew.
Now, through that song, a fighter-squadron's drone I hear
From Scratchbury Camp, whose turfed and cowslip'd rampart seems
More hill than history, ageless and oblivion-blurred.

I walk the fosse, once manned by bronze and flint-head spear; On war's imperious wing the shafted sun-ray gleams: One with the warm sweet air of summer stoops the bird.

Cloud shadows, drifting slow like heedless daylight dreams, Dwell and dissolve; uncircumstanced they pause and pass. I watch them go. My horse, contented, crops the grass.

WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS

Spring moves into summer and our local countryside assumes its idyllic green mantle. Our gardens have greened up and the bright colours of summer are just emerging. However all is not idyllic in our lives. The spectrum of galloping inflation has raised its ugly head. Not everyone in our rural area will cope with the deep financial difficulties ahead and I often feel that we do not have as easy access to the same safety networks as those in towns. There are many around us on fixed incomes and pensions who are having to absorb 10% inflation and cope with rural isolation. This group also includes many families on low incomes who struggle not only to feed and care for families but also to fund the additional cost of travel to work from their villages. Many are too proud to ask for help but we all need to be very alert in the rural community in which we are privileged to live and keep a particularly close watch for those who may need a bit of help.

Every village that I represent experiences planning issues. Sometimes these are unwelcome housing developments, sometimes these may be unwelcome dwelling alterations, and sometimes these are simply developments that herald change. Most development plans are legal and a few are not. I well remember nearly twenty years ago the wise District Councillor who was retiring and where I was campaigning to succeed him giving me advice to go carefully with planning issues as there are no votes in planning. Some will be in favour and some against and how true that is. Occasionally as the local Councillor I end up in the role as mediator. More often than not this role is more accurately "rumour slayer" and calming emotions. We all have to live together and our communities will inevitably develop but where planning issues are concerned talking always is a good start. That is the case in the development of a local pub where most want the pub open and where I have recently been to see what is happening and have started to try to smooth relations and kill rumours as we move towards the inevitable reopening.

Last month I was privileged to take my family to attend the first Platinum Jubilee celebration at the Royal Windsor Horse Show. Her Majesty clearly hugely enjoyed the celebration as much as we did and was radiant as ever. Our Queen has given so much to our Country over the past seventy years and let us wish her a peaceful and happy remainder of her reign and a very happy Platinum Jubilee. God Save the Queen!

Parish Council Meeting

Abridged Minutes From Meeting Held Wednesday 18th May 2022

Present. Councillors W Scott (Chairman), R Bruges, S Chown, J Hailey, M Kasasian, C Wade and the Clerk, Roger Coleman. Wiltshire Council Cllr. J Seed attended Part-time. Cllr. W Scott was elected Chairman for the meeting.

Apologies. Apologies for non-attendance were received and accepted from Cllrs. P Smith and V Bodman.

The Chairman, Cllr. Scott announced the untimely death of Cllr. Steve Rimmer. He stated that Steve had been a stalwart and very active member of the Parish Council since his appointment in May 2007, and more especially to the parishioners of Semington. The Chairman commented that Steve left a lasting and enduring legacy to the village resulting from his enthusiasm and as a local advocate for promoting the planting of trees in the village and for leading on other green initiatives — examples of which included the Jubilee Wood, the ten oak trees opposite the Crematorium. Cllr. Scott concluded by stating that Steve's legacy will last for a long time and that his humour and contributions at Council meetings will be missed.

Wiltshire Council Report. Cllr. Seed gave a brief report on the current situation regarding the refurbishment of the Lamb on the Strand Public House and he explained the reason for some of the controversy surrounding this refurbishment.

Planning and Development. The Council examined the following planning application and **resolved** to send comments to Wiltshire Council as shown in italics: PL/2022/03378 2 St George's Court replacement front door and window - *no objections*. The Council examined the following planning applications received after 11th May 2022 and **resolved** to send comments to Wiltshire Council as shown in italics: PL/2022/03673 Land to west of 5A High Street; erection of 3 bedroom detached chalet bungalow – *no objections* and PL/2022/03696 5A High Street addition of dormer window to extend bedroom and create WC *no objections*

Neighbourhood Plan (NP). The Chairman, Cllr. Scott, gave the following report (shown in italics) which he read out to the Council: As the parish council noted in April, the neighbourhood plan steering group has asked Wiltshire Council to write to all those landowners in the parish (and/or their agents) who have expressed an interest in developing their land. Wiltshire Council has now done this, requesting that the landowners / agents write to the neighbourhood plan steering group if they want their land to be considered as part of the neighbourhood plan. The steering group will then forward a proforma questionnaire asking for full details of what is proposed. The deadline for this response is the end of June. In parallel with this there will be an insert in the next parish magazine inviting all villagers to identify any land in the parish that they think might usefully have a change of use. The deadline for responses is also the end of June. After this, the proposals will be evaluated by external consultants who will report on the suitability of the land for whatever development is proposed. A village consultation will follow this and proposals will then be made about whether to identify land for development as part of the neighbourhood plan.

Finance. Total balance in hand as at 8th May 2022 £56,724.80

Environment and Streetscene. Rights of Way: Following a comment by Cllr. Bruges the Clerk stated that he had yet to write to Wiltshire Council requesting that they investigate that Path SEMI 8/10 had recently had a further two gates fitted that provided an obstacle to horse riders and other users of that bridleway and whether such gates were appropriate on this bridleway when there were no animals to protect but would do so directly. The Chairman reported that a request had been received from the owner of the affected farm that said path be diverted. The Council resolved that it would support this diversion provided that the alternative path proposed was a suitable path and that the request was not designed to eliminate Path SEMI 8/10 without a replacement. Cllr. Bruges enquired whether the Parish Council was in a position to contribute financially to the installation of 'dog gates' and/or new stiles. The Chairman commented that the Parish Council could only do so for land within Semington parish and noted that a Ramblers / Wiltshire Council Rights of Way Team / local volunteers working party often did this work. He added that it was clear that there are a number of stiles in the parish that need repair or replacement. He asked Cllr. Bruges to bring problematic stiles to his attention.

Other Matters. Cllr. Wade confirmed that the Village Hall Management Committee had agreed that the existing three noticeboards could be removed from the front of the Village Hall and that two new Parish Council noticeboards could be installed to replace the removed Parish Council ones. The Chairman stated that the design of noticeboard will be decided at the next meeting. Cllr. Hailey stated that the application process had commenced for additional tree planting to address the Queen's Green Canopy initiative please see page 16 for further details The Chairman commented that he and Cllr. Smith intended to have a conversation with the various landowners involved and that this initiative fitted in well with the development of the Neighbourhood Plan as through this (and following approval) particular plots of land could be identified as areas for tree planting. Cllr. Hailey confirmed that the Village Litter Pick is to take place on Thursday 2nd June 2022 10.00am – Volunteers to meet at the Village Hall.

Transport and Traffic. Cllr. Wade reported that the results of the Wiltshire Council Traffic Survey at the High Street, Semington had been published and that they indicated that although mean recorded speeds were only very slightly above 30mph, Semington would qualify for the establishment of a Community Speed Watch Scheme. Cllr. Wade agreed to write an article on this matter for the forthcoming issue of the Village Newsletter.

Recreation and Wellbeing. Cllr. Wade stated that there was nothing to report in respect of the allotments. The Chairman and Clerk stated that there had been no costed proposals presented to the Parish Council for implementing the increased security at the Football ground. Cllr. Bruges reported that the church continues to investigate refurbishment — especially in respect of adding toilets. He added that the Parochial Church Council (PCC) is keen to obtain a detailed estimate of the work and cost involved and wished to engage a Quantity Surveyor to assist in providing this estimate — the cost of engaging a Quantity Surveyor was estimated to be £1000 and he enquired whether the Parish Council would consider making a contribution to this cost. The Council expressed their support in principle for making a contribution but requested Cllr, Bruges to ask the PCC to make a formal application to the Parish Council for it to consider.

Melksham Foodbank

As ever, I would like to thank everyone who has donated items to the Melksham Foodbank. Although donations have gone down from the heady heights of two years ago, everything you give is greatly appreciated. With inflation on the rise and everyone feeling it, it is hard to keep giving, but their need is greater than ever and the demand for the Foodbank has increased, so please just keep giving whatever you can.

This can be done through a number of supermarkets in Melksham, or by bringing any long life items to St George's Church porch before 6.00pm on a Wednesday, or to the Somerset Arms pub anytime. I am grateful to John at the Church and John at the pub for their continued support. At the time of writing, the Foodbank is short of the following: tinned meat, tinned fruit, UHT milk, biscuits and toilet rolls. You may not be aware that the Foodbank volunteers are happy to also have bulk purchases of things like large bags of rice, which can then be decanted into many smaller bags for families or individuals in need. This is a cost effective way of buying in bulk. If you want to know what to buy there is a list on the noticeboard in the Church porch, but anything with a long best before date is very welcome. No fresh items though, thank you.

The Queen's Green Canopy

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022, which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

The Woodland Trust are supporting the Queen's Green Canopy and have a scheme where schools and community groups (such as residents' associations, Scout and Girlguiding groups, youth and sports clubs, Rotary Clubs, etc) can apply for **free tree packs** and plant trees for the Platinum Jubilee. The application window for November delivery of trees is now open and is on a 'first come first served' basis. If applying for trees as a community group, the land needs to be accessible to the public. You should also make sure your local community are aware of your plans to plant and are happy for you to go ahead. For individuals wishing to get involved, the Woodland Trust recommends that you order a tree from a certified Plant Healthy nursery in your local area. Alternatively, the Woodland Trust will consider applications for their "Urban Tree Pack" to be split between neighbouring front gardens to green up your street.

Recently, I had the pleasure of receiving a 'hard hat' tour of the impressive zero carbon homes being built in Semington. St George's Mead is a collection of 24 zero carbon homes and bungalows, which include a variety of features such as solar panels, air source heat pumps and wiring provision for electric vehicle charging points. This scheme will also have new footpath connections, generous green space, large gardens and new allotments.

On Sunday 8th May, I and my team, took part in the 'It's A Knock Out' fundraising event organised by our wonderful Wiltshire Air Ambulance. The sun was shining at Melksham Rugby Club, and it was a fantastic day. I can report that me and my team received a respectful 108 points and finished in the middle of the pack. Stonewood Builders finished in first place and were very deserving of doing so. At the time of writing, we have raised over £1,600 for the Air Ambulance and I am very grateful for the kind donations from our local community. It costs £11,000 a day to keep our Air Ambulance in the air and the money raised will go a long way to keeping our beloved community asset flying. I look forward to returning next year and, hopefully, taking the crown from Stonewood!

The situation on the ground in Ukraine is truly terrifying and my heart goes out to all the people of Ukraine who have been impacted by President Putin's illegal invasion. My first instinct was to do what I can to help and I used my office as a collection point for local people to donate goods and supplies which were then shipped off to Poland to help. To further help, I have now launched my prize draw to raise money for the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC). At £5.00 per entry, you can enter any number of times, meaning £10.00 will get you two entries, £15.00 three entries etc. Prizes generously donated by local businesses include: A Bramblecrest Chatsworth Recliner Set, donated by Whitehall Garden Centres (RRP £989.99); An LG Mini beam Nano Projector, donated by Nestle (RRP c. £299.99), and a £200 voucher for Watling Goldsmiths in Lacock among many others. 

Green Party 60 Second Survey - Feedback

In January 2022 Catherine Read and Green Party volunteers undertook a survey in Semington to find out residents' concerns which will help to focus our efforts and set our priorities for local action. This is how well residents thought Wiltshire Council supported the following:

- Most residents thought there was too much new house building (68%)
- That waste and recycling services were just right (84%)
- Majority thought that there are too few road repairs, including potholes (81%)
- The vast majority of residents didn't know if Wiltshire Council were supporting care for older people (53%), social housing (68%), addressing climate change (58%) or apprenticeships/training for the young (66%)
- Views on public transport were more evenly split between too little (44%) and just right (33%).

The vast majority (90%) of residents thought that Wiltshire Councils performance was average or better, however, 68% did not think the council tax represented value for money. Nearly all (90%) residents surveyed were aware of the proposed A350 Melksham bypass and of those, just over half (51%) thought it **did not** warrant destruction of the landscape.

Two thirds were happy with the bus service, however, these problems were mentioned:

- lack of evening service: not enough buses
- school services: not regular: too expensive
- · poorly maintained vehicles and furniture

The majority (82%) of residents found their broadband to be good or average.

Other concerns were raised about waste, transport/rights of ways and environment.

Thought from the Rectory

On 6th February 1952, Princess Elizabeth became Queen. This year we celebrate the 70th anniversary of her reign and as I write, celebrations are reaching their final stage of planning to mark this amazing milestone.

The Queen has spoken on many occasions since of how her Christian faith has sustained her during her reign. In her Christmas message of 2014, the year we remembered the beginning of the First World War, she said, 'For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. 
All the usual favourites... music, entertainment, tombola, grannies attic, book and plant stalls, BBQ, cakes, children's games and lots more too.
