Semington Neighbourhood Plan – as I write this, the consultation event about the plan (held in the village hall on 22nd April) has just finished. It was attended by 55 of you (many thanks), and you spent time giving your views on **Landscape, Green Spaces,** and the possibility of allocating **Housing Site Land** within the plan. What follows is "headline" feedback on what you told us. More detailed feedback will follow when we've had a chance to analyse all the comments and ideas.

Landscape – 44 thought that the plan should include a policy to protect sensitive landscape areas.

Green Spaces – 42 thought that the plan should include a policy to designate some green spaces that meet designation criteria.

Housing Site Allocation – 27 thought that the plan should consider allocating a site for development, with 9 saying "maybe" and none saying "no".

Where you thought that the plan should consider allocating a site for housing development, you gave your views on four sites assessed by our consultants as "suitable" or "potentially suitable". You said that if the plan were to identify such a site, one site (Site 1, west of Semington Turnpike and north of the A361) was clearly preferred to the other three sites.

If you didn't manage to attend the consultation, we still need your views, and you have until 10th May to contribute. There are two ways for you to do this:

- Visit the Parish Council website: semington.org.uk and, under the Neighbourhood Plan tab, you will find the consultation papers and questions.
- 'Phone me on 870888, and leave a message plus your 'phone number if I'm not able to take your call.

If we don't hear from you, the next stage is for the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group to analyse all the information and use it to shape our landscape, green spaces and housing allocation policies.

Post Office – is due to open on **24**th **April**, operating out of the DG Car Sales office with support of Dennis, for which many thanks. Opening hours from 10.00am – 12.00noon on Mondays and Thursdays. Please support Kate our postmistress by using the service.

Village Hall Social Club – the Parish Council passed a vote of thanks to all involved in very quickly extending the opening hours of the club which, following the very sad closure of the Somerset Arms, offers an alternative convivial space for people to meet and relax.

Abridged Minutes from Parish Council Meeting

Meeting Held Wednesday 19th April 2023

Present. Councillors P Smith (Chairman), R. Bruges, S. Chown, J. Hailey, M. Kasasian, C. McGarvey, W. Scott, C. Wade and the Clerk, Roger Coleman. There were no members of the public present.

Apologies. Wiltshire Council, Cllr. J Seed tendered his apologies for non-attendance.

Wiltshire Council Report. In the absence of Cllr Seed no report was given. However, the Chairman stated that in a recent conversation with Cllr. Seed, the following matters were raised: Cllr. Seed had been in contact with Michelle Donelan MP regarding the closure of the Post Office and the Somerset Arms Public House and she had offered her full support in maintaining these assets in the village. The Post Office is to reopen and is to be relocated in the DG Car Sales premises – Mondays and Thursdays 10am to 12 Noon.

Community and Communication. The Chairman confirmed that an application has been made to Wiltshire Council to register the Somerset Arms as an 'Asset of Community Value' and that this application had been acknowledged. A key date is 23rd May 2023 when a decision by Wiltshire Council whether to register the 'asset' will be made. Cllr. Bruges stated that he had been in contact with the Managing Agents for the owners of the Public House – the Wellington Group – and it was confirmed that attempts are in hand to re-let it to new tenants. Cllr. Bruges commented that the Social Committee of the Village Hall had been very supportive of providing additional facilities at the Village Hall – especially longer and earlier opening hours for the bar – in order to compensate for the closure of the Somerset Arms – a move that had proved very popular. The Parish Council <u>resolved</u> to express its thanks to the Social Committee and especially to Marilyn Taylor. Cllr. Scott confirmed that Pinnacle Data Management Ltd had completed the digitising of the 'Semington Past and Present' book and that he now had the software file copy.

Recreation and Wellbeing. The Clerk reported that he had not received any further correspondence regarding the transfer of the Allotment Site to the Parish Council from either Newland Homes Ltd or Forrester Sylvester Mackett (Solicitors). He added that he would invite them to provide an update and to also copy all correspondence to the Chairman. Cllr. Chown stated that a site meeting is to be held at the Wessex Close Play Area on 20th April with Wiltshire Council (Craig Campbell and Fiona Waind) in order to clarify the outstanding matters relating to a possible Asset Transfer to the Parish Council. Outstanding matters related mainly to the responsibilities of the Parish Council if the ownership/maintenance of the Wessex Close Play Area is transferred from Wiltshire Council to the Parish Council by means of an Asset Transfer. Cllr. Scott stated that it would be necessary for Wiltshire Council and the Parish Council to agree on the specification and exact area to be covered in any Asset Transfer. Cllr. Chown added that she had received a draft s52 Agreement relating to the Asset Transfer from Wiltshire Council. The Council resolved to delay a decision whether to accept the Asset Transfer of the Wessex Close Play Area until the May Parish Council meeting. Cllr. Scott emphasized that the role, responsibilities and status of the proposed Friends of Wessex Close Play Area Group need to be defined and agreed and that its relationship to the Parish Council also needs to be discussed and confirmed. Cllr. Bruges gave a full report on the proposed celebrations for the King's Coronation on 6th May 2023 and he identified the likely expenditure that it would involve.

The Council <u>resolved</u> to agree a budget of £750 within which there was to be an immediate and approved expense of £250 for the Coronation Band and a further £250 for the purchase (as a long-term Parish Council asset) of a marquee. Other costs identified and approved were £76.98 – Road Closure signs, Bunting - £24, Publicity - £50 (to be confirmed), Prizes - £50 (to be confirmed). He added that the Road Closure Order had been approved and would operate 12 noon to 4.00pm.

Environment and Streetscene. Cllr. Scott reported that he had not had a reply from Wiltshire in relation to his queries concerning the results of the SEMI9a/HILP22/10 'Cycleway' Safety Audit and associated Report. He stated that he will continue to seek clarification from Wiltshire Council and would investigate possible additional safety measures that could be introduced. Cllr. Hailey stated that she was still awaiting a response from Wiltshire Council to her remaining queries regarding the tree planting in support of the Queen's Green Canopy project. Cllr. Scott reminded councillors that a s106 Agreement in respect of planning application PL/2022/01367 had allocated £3800 for public rights of way improvements and that he is still awaiting confirmation from Wiltshire Council that this money will be used to improve those rights of way in the parish of Semington. Cllr. Scott drew the Council's attention that Path SEMI 6/10 had been ploughed up and planted with crops. The Clerk was asked to write to the owners of the field and to request reinstatement of this public footpath. Cllr. Hailey commented that it may be necessary for the Parish Council to purchase its own lawnmower and other gardening implements if the Parish Council was likely to take on the responsibility of several grassed areas in the village. The Clerk was asked to add this item to the Agenda for the October or November Parish Council meetings.

Transport and Traffic. Cllr. Wade confirmed that he would ensure that the subject of the ANPR Camera that Semington Parish Council wished to be used for the 'Bus Gate' enforcement would be on the Agenda for the next LHFIG Meeting that will be held in April. The Chairman confirmed that Melksham Without Parish Council, in whose parish the camera would be located, fully supported this project.

Planning and Development. There were no planning applications received after 12th April 2023. The Chairman commented that in respect of the possible Ashford Homes development, the Neighbourhood Plan Community event planned for 22nd April would provide an opportunity to garner comments regarding this and three other possible developments from members of the public. There was no further discussion in relation to the Greenacres site.

Finance. Total Balance in hand as at 20th April 2023 £79,880.43

The Community Development Fund Working Group (CDFWG) confirmed that only one application for funding had been received and this was being considered. The Council <u>resolved</u> that the Insurance Policy with Zurich Municipal is to be renewed for one year only at a cost of £931.21 because it is likely that there would need to be major changes to the Policy resulting from additional responsibilities being adopted by the Council and any benefit from a 3-year deal that was offered by Zurich Municipal was unlikely to be realised. Once the changes are added, the Council will be invited to decide whether, for 2024/25, it is content to renew with Zurich Municipal or if it chooses to seek further quotes from other insurers. The Council <u>resolved</u> to make the payments of £250 for the Coronation Band, £250 for the Marquee, £54 to Pinnacle Data Management Ltd and £8.65 to Cllr. Scott (Land Registry application and postage). The Council noted and <u>resolved</u> that further payments of £76.98 and £24.24 are to be made for the road closure sign and bunting respectively. The Clerk invited the Council to examine the current reserves held by the Parish Council and to agree to earmark some of these reserves for previously identified projects. It was acknowledged that the majority of these reserves had accumulated as a result of the Community Infrastructure Levy (£28324.42) and the Neighbourhood Plan Grant (Groundwork UK) (£12083).

Councillors commented that the Parish Council had adopted a formal process for inviting parishioners to propose possible 'community projects' for the disbursement of the Community Infrastructure Levy funds and that this process was now operating. The Council resolved to earmark reserves as shown:

Provision of Allotments	£5,000
Adoption & Refurbishment of Wessex Close Play Area	£20,000
Tennis Court Maintenance & Repair	£7,500
Neighbourhood Plan	£10,000
Community Projects	£20,000
TOTAL:	£62,500

General Reserve £21,500

Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr. Smith confirmed that Neighbourhood Plan Group is continuing to meet on a regular basis and that development of the Neighbourhood Plan is continuing. Cllr. Smith stated that the next Village Consultation is to be held on 22^{nd} April 2023 at the Village Hall -11.00am to 3.00pm - and that the event had been, and will continue to be, well advertised. He expressed the wish that it would be well attended and added that comments received from the public will be central to the subsequent content of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Date of the next meeting. Councillors commented that in the past, the Annual Parish meeting had been very poorly attended – and on occasions no members of the public had attended. Additionally, a number of Community meetings have been held this year with particular reference to the Neighbourhood Plan which had been well attended by members of the public and the Parish Council meeting was always preceded by a 'Public Participation' item when parishioners and electors were invited to raise any matters of interest. The Parish Council had also taken the opportunity on a number of occasions to extend the Public Participation element to accommodate concerns raised by members of the public. A vote was taken, and the Parish Council <u>resolved</u> unanimously not to hold an Annual Parish Meeting this year.

The Council noted that the next Ordinary Parish Council meeting would be held on **Wednesday 17**th **May 2023** commencing at 8pm and preceded by the Annual Parish Council meeting at 7.30pm.



Wiltshire Councillor News From Jonathon Seed

There is always considerable activity as we move into the new Financial year. Easter is behind us and summer beckons. Council and Councillor activities also change. For my own part the round of evening Parish Council meetings becomes less of a struggle through dark and wet lanes and more of a drive of appreciation for what we are lucky to have in our local rural Wiltshire landscape.

However there is often considerable clearing up to do after a wet winter and before the autumn rains come again. In the local area there is considerable work still outstanding on Common Hill, Steeple Ashton, with extensive drain and carriageway repairs needed. A knock on from this is the damage caused to lanes and verges around Great Hinton by diverted traffic. In addition there are blocked drains and gullies in several villages that need attention. All of this will be followed up by both me and your Parish Council over the summer.

There is good news for Wiltshire Council Highways in that the Council has received more than £26m Government funding for highways maintenance and to continue the potholes fight. This funding will be spent on a range of highways maintenance and improvement programmes including resurfacing, new road markings, replacing traffic signs and signals, and filling potholes. The council has also received an additional £3,684,800 from the Department for Transport's Pothole Fund which the Council will use to repair potholes around the county. The Council have filled 11,130 potholes and completed 28 major resurfacing projects so far this financial year. However to get roads repaired and potholes filled in our area we must use the MyWilts app and report them. It is quick and easy to use. IF A POTHOLE IS NOT REPORTED IT WILL NOT GET FILLED! So the more local activity with smart phones in roads the better our local roads will become.

Finally I join with many residents to express concern over the future of our village pubs. The Lamb on the Strand remains closed and the Somerset Arms has also closed its doors. Let us hope that both these closures are temporary. However the mantra with village pubs is very much "use it or lose it". So as we enter the summer months using village pubs is a necessary and welcome challenge for us all!

Welcome to my latest update, I hope you are well and were able to have a peaceful and enjoyable Easter break with friends and family. I was making the most of recess from Parliament in the first two weeks of April, including holding my regular constituent advice surgeries and visiting local charities and businesses.

To update you on my article in last month's issue, I recently organised a meeting with Wiltshire Councillors to raise their concerns with the Housing Minister regarding planning and speculative development. From my surgery in the village earlier this year with ClIr Seed, I know that this is something which many are concerned about. Melksham and the surrounding areas have had its fair share of housing over the years, and I have been actively advocating for measures to address this with successive Housing Secretaries. As part of this effort, I have campaigned successfully to lower the number of new builds allocated to Wiltshire.

During the meeting the Minister spoke about the new Infrastructure Levy, which will be paid by developers based on the sale price of new builds directly to councils to ensure that local infrastructure grows in line with the number of new homes being built. Additionally, the Levelling Up Secretary has changed the rules to ensure that Councils with up-to-date local plans will no longer need to demonstrate a 5-year supply of housing sites, which will make a real difference in reducing the number of speculative planning applications. Overall, the meeting was a useful opportunity for local councillors to feed into the process based on concerns of residents and help ensure the Levelling-up and Regeneration Bill works successfully for areas like ours. The Bill is still going through Parliament currently, so I will be following up by writing to the Minister to feed in suggestions and thoughts from our councillors to help make sure the system works for Wiltshire.

Elsewhere, more than 20,000 pensioners in our constituency will receive a 10.1% increase to their state pension from last month - the largest cash increase ever. This record increase is a result of our commitment to the Triple Lock, coming on top of other support like Pension Credit, Winter Fuel Payments, Pensioner Cost of Living Payments and free TV licences for the over 75s. Maintaining the Triple Lock is something I have always consistently supported and pushed for directly since becoming your MP, as I believe it is absolutely vital we support those in later life and make sure everyone receives all of the support they are entitled to.

Finally, I have worked with my fellow Wiltshire MP's to help secure over £5.4 million of further Government funding to extend the Household Support Fund, supporting vulnerable families in our community with the cost of living. This funding has already helped to support local families through one-off payments, and comes on top of other support like dedicated Cost of Living Payments, uprating benefits in line with inflation, Government energy bill support, and increasing the minimum wage. I do absolutely understand that families and individuals who are not in the benefits system have also faced difficulties with the cost of living, so this fund will ensure that there is help available in Wiltshire for those who need it but are not claiming specific benefits. Thought From The Rectory

When Queen Elizabeth II died in September, her son Charles immediately became King. In our constitution, there isn't any moment when we don't have a monarch, but because we need a time of mourning and the arrangements take a while to organise, the coronation of the new monarch is arranged a few months later. As I'm sure you are all aware, the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla will take place on May 6th.

British coronations have at their heart an Anglican service conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury at Westminster Abbey. The King is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England, "The Church in which my own faith is so deeply rooted," he said, following the death of his mother.

The King's coronation will include three significant ceremonies: his taking of oaths, his anointing and then the crowning. It is the anointing which is the most sacred moment and will take place in private, away from the television cameras. It is a personal moment for the King, between him and God, when oil prepared and blessed in Jerusalem will be used to signify God's blessing on him, to sustain him through the years ahead. We use oil to anoint those being baptised and confirmed in our Churches for the same reason. Although very significant, it is only an outward sign of the special relationship God wants to have with each of us, whoever we are. We are all equal in God's Kingdom and his blessings are available to all of us.

May God Bless King Charles III and Queen Camilla richly during their reign.


